New AI Program 95% Accurate at Predicting Where Paper Will be Ultimately Published



(London, UK) Computational Scientists working at UK-based DeClined, this week reported the success of their stunningly accurate publication-prediction platform, JustFoldAlready. The breakthrough is being hailed as the greatest advancement in the manuscript submission process since the rapid reject. "We think this is going make scientific publishing much more efficient in terms of

how reviewers and editors are spending their time," said CEO Dennis Hassabis. "In fact, our platform will make journal assignments less prone to arbitrary factors and will allow busy scientists to focus on what really matters, trashing each other's grant proposals". Factors including manuscript title, abstract, and key terms are factored into consideration along with the corresponding author's zip code and ORCID iD. If widely adopted, the "amazing algorithm" will be used to decide whether publications end up in 'sexy journals' such as Cell, Science, and Nature, or will be relegated to lower-tier chronicles such as Trends in Floral Arrangements, Hoof, or The International Journal of Hungarian Biochemistry. "This is a win-win situation for everyone," said Hassabis. "An agonizing ordeal that used to drag out for months or even years can now be transformed into an exquisitely painful process that literally takes seconds!"
